Your breast core biopsy was performed by

Please note that after having a breast core needle biopsy it is normal for your breast to be tender and uncomfortable for a few hours.

What do I need to do post biopsy?

- please keep the biopsy site clean and dry today. You may shower normally tomorrow.
- The outer bandage may be removed tomorrow while the 'steristrips' should be left to fall off by themselves. (This may take several days)
- We recommend that you avoid strenuous work and/or exercise today. You may return to normal activities tomorrow.

If I require pain relief what should I use?

- We recommend using oral 'Paracetamol'. Please avoid Aspirin, 'Nurofen' or anti-inflammatory medications unless you take them regularly for other medical reasons as these may cause increased bruising.
- Application of an ice pack to the site of biopsy often provides pain relief.

What complications should I watch for?

- **Bruising:** Bruising around the biopsy site is normal and common. Please note that bruising may take a number of weeks to resolve.
- **Bleeding:** If you notice bleeding from the wound please place firm pressure on the biopsy site for ten minutes. If

the wound continues to bleed, contact us on one of the phone numbers listed

- ***Infection: the signs of infection are as follows***

- Severe pain at the biopsy site.
- Discharge from the wound.
- Increased body temperature (shivers and rigors)
